

With reference to the above Application, the Metropolitan Police Service (MPS) wishes to make a Representation.

Within the Licensing Act 2003, and contained in the notes for guidance for the Licensing Act 2003, it is the responsibility of the Police and Local Authority to promote the Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Promote Public Safety, Prevent Public Nuisance and Protect Children from Harm.

I certify that I have considered the application above on its own merit, and my Representation is based on the likely effect of the grant of the application being detrimental to Camden Council's Licensing Objectives.

Looking at Case law, during the case of Daniel Thwaites PLC v Wirral Magistrates' Court and Others, The Honourable Mrs Justice Black said:

"Drawing on local knowledge, at least the local knowledge of local licensing authorities, is an important feature of the Act's approach. There can be little doubt that local magistrates are also entitled to take into account their own knowledge but, in my judgment, they must measure their own views against the evidence presented to them. In some cases, the evidence presented will require them to adjust their own impression. This is particularly likely to be so where it is given by a Responsible Authority such as the police."

This case is sometimes misconstrued as requiring decisions to be based on 'real evidence', and that conditions cannot be imposed until problems have actually occurred. This is wrong. The purpose of the Act is to prevent problems from happening. Decisions can and should be based on well-informed common sense. The case recognises that Responsible Authorities are experts in their fields, and that weight should be attached to their representations. Policing Challenges in Camden

The London Borough of Camden is an intense area of crime and anti-social behaviour, particularly in relation to the Night Time Economy. Police resources become heavily drained during the relevant times. There is an increment of violence in Camden during later hours. For clarity, the MPS supports Camden Council's Licensing Policy with regards to Recommended Framework Hours and the Special Policy Areas (also referred to as the Cumulative Impact Areas).

Unique Application Issues:

This venue is situated within a busy commercial district with numerous other licensed venues. The Kilburn High Road corridor is significantly affected by thefts. The thefts appear to be committed by organised thieves using a number of distraction techniques to steal belongings from shops and visitors

It is worth noting that food only venues tend to have a lower impact on crime and disorder; particularly violence, when compared to public houses, bars and night clubs.

Delivery businesses tend to suffer more from resident complaints over noise, delivery rider ASB and public nuisance issues. Late night refreshment venues generate crime indirectly. With people buying food and standing about on the streets, this helps drug dealers and robbers blend into the background. People hanging around the streets eating their food can be easy targets for people bent on fighting or stealing from vulnerable people. Another flash point is that these venues attract people from different pubs and clubs and sometimes during their brief encounter in the fast food venues, it will sometimes cause issues on the street once they have left the venue. Therefore, prohibiting customer collections will reduce the likelihood of such incidents.

In considering this application I have assessed current policing resources and the ability for Police to respond to incidents if they arise. MetCall (999 Despatch) will primarily be tasking Police Officers parading out of Kentish Town Police Station to this location. Kentish Town Police Station is 2.9 miles away or a 14 minute car journey on Google Maps.

Police licensing are hopeful the Applicant can agree to a limited number of extra Conditions to ensure their operation has a minimal impact on the current crime and disorder in this part of Camden.

Mediation & Discussion

The Applicant Representative and Police licensing are in discussions to find a compromise on Conditions but no agreement has currently been reached.

Research and Intelligence

There were a total of 43 complaints made to Police involving incidents at **licensed venues** in the NW6 postcode so far in 2023. Violence is generally low in the NW6 post code area due to licensed venues having more of a food and dining focus.

Any Licensing Hearing held as a result of this Representation may be supplied with further, specific, crime figures and intelligence reports relating to the venue or the area in which it is located.

Conditions Proposed By Police Licensing

- 1. There will be no customer collection and the premises will only be used for the dispatch of meal orders only.
- 2. CCTV system shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities and are of a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria:
 - a. The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped;
 - b. The CCTV camera views are not to be obstructed.
 - c. The facility to transfer the images to a compatible, removable format, shall be held on the premises
 - d. The medium on which CCTV images are recorded shall be of evidential quality; stored securely; shall be retained for a period of 31 days; and be available for inspection by the Police or Local Authority upon request.
 - e. Copies shall be made available within 24 hours to the Police or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority, upon request;
 - f. A staff member working at the premises shall be trained in the use of CCTV and a log will be kept to verify this.
- 3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and be made available upon request to the Police or the Local Authority. The book will record the date, time and whom is making the entry. The following must be recorded:
 - a. All refused sales
 - b. Any complaints received
 - c. Any faults in the CCTV system
 - d. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
 - e. CAD reference numbers where Police are called.
- 4. All incidents of violence and/or disorder will be reported to the police by the venue.
- 5. All delivery drivers and riders must allow any Police Constable or Local Authority Officer to inspect any alcohol or order details on request.
- 6. The premises will encourage all riders involved in deliveries to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally gather outside the premises; (where vehicles have engines) not to leave engines running when the vehicles are parked; and not to obstruct the highway.
- 7. The business will arrange for the telephone number for the premises and/or a member of the management team to be provided to residents upon request in order that any complaints can be made direct.
- 8. Prominent, clear, and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting staff to respect the needs of local residents to leave the premises quietly.

Times Proposed By Applicant:

The proposed hours are outside the Recommended Framework Hours, but this Application relates to a delivery only operation, making crime and disorder less likely. On this basis, Police Licensing would not be seeking any change to the hours proposed

Conclusion

The Venue is not within a Special Treatment/Cumulative Impact Area and similar operation shave not been a source of crime and disorder. The Applicant proposes conducting licensable activities through deliveries only. Police licensing have asked the Applicant to consider imposing extra Conditions to mitigate common issues with delivery venues in Camden.

In summary, the view of the MPS is that this Application should be rejected <u>in its current</u> <u>form</u>, unless the proposed Conditions from Police are appended to any Licence granted.

This is suggested as the most effective way of allowing the venue to operate whilst minimising any indirect harm.

Hi Joel,

Thanks for bringing this to my attention.

We would like to discuss this further, and if it can help speak directly with you.

Please allow me to give you more information about the business and our operations.

- Based on an accurate analysis of our business company, which includes 36 premises (delivery only kitchens) across London, we are not looking at a high order volume instead at a high order value. This means, after 11pm we are expecting to do one order every 29 mins which leads at 2 orders per hour. Despite the small amount of orders we could get in late hours, it is crucial for our business to increase the sales of £50 per hour (as the average order value is around £25) which means £150 until 2am or £1050 weekly.

- The shop is on the main road with no flat above or next to it. Drivers can park right in front of the premises (on a designated parking area next to the premises) without disturbing any neighbors.

The neighbors are our first customers and we do not want to cause any nuisance. We are a very stable business, very strong brand with immaculate relations with all neighborhoods we are in.

- The shop is always locked and drivers have to ring the bell when they want to collect

orders.

- We are not selling any alcohol

- There is no "click and collect" option but only an online delivery option which means there won't be any member of the public allowed to enter the premises and consumption right in front of the premises.

- CCTV in operations with 30 days recording.

- All other proposed conditions such as Accident book, telephone number, encourage driver to behave etc. are accepted and already met.

I'm pretty sure there are businesses in the area which are allowed to operate this late.

I am confident we can get the licence as per our application to allow a sustainable growth.

A late license, particularly for a delivery based service is highly likely to make the front of our driveway, the high road and the general area very full of noisy delivery motorbikes and scooters - creating a nuisance factor for residents trying to sleep. There is also likely to be a safety issue for residents entering/ exiting their property at night where they are likely to be tailgated in due to an increased foot/ vehicle traffic congregating in front of the main gate. Finally, late night cooking will be throwing up cooking fumes into resident apartments well into the night - preventing us to leave doors/ windows open for ventilation. This is already an existing problem that will be made worse.

Main gate to the property takes 20 seconds to open/ close. If there are many delivery drivers (usually mostly male) waiting to get their next order all the way till 2am, it creates a much bigger opportunity for someone to follow residents into the property and enable criminal activity. This can reasonably be expected to be much worse on Friday and Saturday nights. it creates a personal safety issue (incidents have already occurred) or an anti social behaviour issue (people relieving themselves/ using drugs inside the property because it's more private) or enable thefts (bike storage areas become much more easily accessible).

And at the very least, this will add many more delivery drivers on motorcycles creating a barrier to entrance, late at night, when Kilburn High Road is at its most dangerous period. The noise levels will also be off a nuisance, as there are many families with young children within the apartment complex. Already, sound travels very easily from Kilburn High Road. The shouting of drunken revellers and revved up motorcycles from the road already create disturbances throughout the night. Adding more late night traffic will only cause further harm to families' quality of sleep. Further, Kilburn High Road has had numerous stabbings and late night disorderly behaviour pervasively present. This will add more nuisance and disrupt public safety. Finally, flytipping and littering is at an all time high on Kilburn High Road. With the launch of Fired Away Pizza, Cheat Meals, and other takeaway restaurants, food packaging litters or streets. Adding more rubbish during late night hours, right on our building's doorsteps, for our young children who like to rise early to then trip over or grab and put in their mouths is absolutely unacceptable. I beg you to please remove the late night permissions to this establishments licensing application.

Officer's summary of conditions consistent with the operating schedule

- 1. All CCTV recordings made by the CCTV system shall be retained and stored in a suitable and secure manner for a minimum of 30 days.
- 2. There shall be at least one camera positioned at each entry and exit point to monitor any external areas to the premises and of such quality to enable identification of the recorded person in any light.
- 3. The business will arrange for the telephone number for the premises and/or a member of the management team to be provided to residents upon request in order that any complaints can be made direct.
- 4. The premises will encourage all riders involved in deliveries to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally gather outside the premises; (where vehicles have engines) not to leave engines running when the vehicles are parked; and not to obstruct the highway.
- 5. Displayed a signage stating that all riders who do not behave or cause any nuisance will be not entitle to collect the food

Conditions agreed with the Police responsible authority

- 1. There will be no customer collection and the premises will only be used for the dispatch of meal orders only.
- 2. CCTV system shall be installed, operated, and maintained, to function all times that the premises is open for licensable activities and are of a standard acceptable to and approved by the Police. Said CCTV will comply with the following criteria:
 - a. The system will record in real time and recordings will be date and time stamped;
 - b. The CCTV camera views are not to be obstructed.
 - c. The facility to transfer the images to a compatible, removable format, shall be held on the premises
 - d. The medium on which CCTV images are recorded shall be of evidential quality; stored securely; shall be retained for a period of 31 days; and be available for inspection by the Police or Local Authority upon request.
 - e. Copies shall be made available within 24 hours to the Police or an authorised officer of the Licensing Authority, upon request;
 - f. A staff member working at the premises shall be trained in the use of CCTV and a log will be kept to verify this.
- 3. An incident log shall be kept at the premises and be made available upon request to the Police or the Local Authority. The book will record the date, time and whom is making the entry. The following must be recorded:
 - a. All refused sales

- b. Any complaints received
- c. Any faults in the CCTV system
- d. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service
- e. CAD reference numbers where Police are called.
- 4. All incidents of violence and/or disorder will be reported to the police by the venue.
- 5. All delivery drivers and riders must allow any Police Constable or Local Authority Officer to inspect any alcohol or order details on request.
- 6. The premises will encourage all riders involved in deliveries to use their vehicles in a responsible manner so as not to cause a nuisance to any residents or generally gather outside the premises; (where vehicles have engines) not to leave engines running when the vehicles are parked; and not to obstruct the highway.
- 7. The business will arrange for the telephone number for the premises and/or a member of the management team to be provided to residents upon request in order that any complaints can be made direct.
- 8. Prominent, clear, and legible notices must be displayed at all exits requesting staff to respect the needs of local residents to leave the premises quietly.

Section 1: Background comments of the Borough Solicitor

- 1.1 The purpose of Camden's Statement of Licensing Policy is to make it clear to applicants that wider considerations will be taken into account when determining applications. It is intended to guide the Licensing Panel when considering licence applications. However, the Licensing Panel must always consider each application on its own merits and allow exceptions to the normal policy where the circumstances of the application justify allowing an exception. The burden is on the applicant to show that they comply with the policy.
- 1.2 Members should only address those matters that have formed the subject matter of relevant representations. Matters that arise that are not the subject of relevant representations fall outside the function that the Panel is exercising when it holds a hearing
- 1.3 Members must determine, having regard for the evidence, whether granting the application for a premises licence will impact adversely on the policy criteria listed in paragraph 3 of this report.
- 1.4 In accordance with the provisions of Part 1 of Schedule 5 of the Act, where a Licensing Authority rejects in whole or in part, an application for a new premises licence, the applicant may appeal against the decision, to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.5 Similarly, where a person who made relevant representations in relation to the application contends that the licence ought not to have been granted, or that different or additional conditions should have been imposed on the licence, he may appeal against the decision to a magistrate's court within 21 days of being notified of the decision.
- 1.6 **The Human Rights Act 1998** incorporates the key articles of the European Convention on Human Rights into domestic law. Decisions on licensing matters are actions of a public authority and must be compatible with Convention rights. Consequently, Members of the Panel must be aware of the rights contained in the Convention (particularly those set out below) when making licensing decisions.

(a) Article 6: Right to a fair trial

In the determination of his civil rights and obligations, everyone is entitled to a fair and public hearing within a reasonable time by an independent and impartial tribunal established by law.

(b) Article 8: Right to respect for private and family life

Everyone has a right to respect for his or her private life, his home and correspondence.

(c) Article 1 of the First Protocol: Protection of property

Every natural or legal person is entitled to the peaceful enjoyment of his possessions, including a licence. No one shall be deprived of his possession except in the public interest and subject to the conditions provided for by law and by the general principles of international law.

(d) Article 10: Freedom of Expression

Everyone has the right to freedom of expression. This right shall include freedom to hold opinions and to receive and impart information and ideas without interference by public authority and regardless of frontiers. This Article shall not prevent States from requiring the licensing of broadcasting, television or cinema enterprises.

The exercise of these freedoms since it carries with it duties and responsibilities may be subject to such formalities, conditions, restrictions or penalties as are prescribed by law and are necessary in a democratic society, in the interests of national security, territorial integrity or public safety, for the prevention of disorder or crime, for the protection of health and morals, for the protection of the reputation or rights of others, for preventing the disclosure of information received in confidence, or for maintaining the authority and impartiality of the judiciary.

(e) Article 14: Prohibition of discrimination

The enjoyment of the rights and freedoms set forth in this Convention shall be secured without discrimination on any ground such as sex, race, colour, language, religion, political or other opinion, national or social origin, association with a national minority, property, birth, or other status.

1.7 When formulating policy local authorities must have regard to the **Equality Act 2010**. The Act provides protection from discrimination in respect of certain protected characteristics, namely: age, disability, gender reassignment, pregnancy and maternity, race, religion or beliefs and sex and sexual orientation. It places the Council under a legal duty to have due regard to the advancement of equality in the exercise of its powers including licensing powers. Members of the panel must be mindful of this duty when determining all licensing applications.

The section 149 Public Sector Equality Duty

(1)A public authority must, in the exercise of its functions, have due regard to the need to—

- (a) eliminate discrimination, harassment, victimisation and any other conduct that is prohibited by or under this Act;
- (b) advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it;
- (c) foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it.

(2) A person who is not a public authority but who exercises public functions must, in the exercise of those functions, have due regard to the matters mentioned in subsection (1).

(3) Having due regard to the need to advance equality of opportunity between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it involves having due regard, in particular, to the need to—

(a) remove or minimise disadvantages suffered by persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are connected to that characteristic;
(b) take steps to meet the needs of persons who share a relevant protected characteristic that are different from the needs of persons who do not share it;
(c) encourage persons who share a relevant protected characteristic to participate in public life or in any other activity in which participation by such persons is disproportionately low.

(4) The steps involved in meeting the needs of disabled persons that are different from the needs of persons who are not disabled include, in particular, steps to take account of disabled persons' disabilities.

(5) Having due regard to the need to foster good relations between persons who share a relevant protected characteristic and persons who do not share it involves having due regard, in particular, to the need to—

(a) tackle prejudice, and

(b) promote understanding.

(6)Compliance with the duties in this section may involve treating some persons more favourably than others; but that is not to be taken as permitting conduct that would otherwise be prohibited by or under this Act.

- 1.8 In determining any application, the Council must comply with the public sector equality duty in s.149 of the 2010 Act. This is a duty to have regard to the need to achieve the statutory goals of s.149, rather than to achieve a particular result. The s149 duty sits alongside and does not override statutory requirements in relation to determining licensing applications, including the duty to consider all evidence on its merits and the legislative criteria listed at paragraphs 3 & 4.
- 1.9 When members have before them representations or other material on issues relevant to s149, even outside the scope of "standard" licensing considerations such material must still be specifically assessed in the context of s149. However, because s149 creates a requirement to "have regard" the fact a matter raised is relevant to s149 will not automatically translate into a reason for refusing an application that would be sustainable in any subsequent appeal, given the legal requirement to determine applications in compliance with licensing legislation.
