

## **Item 8: Youth Justice Plan 2025–2028 and Feedback on Youth Justice Inspection Report**

The following paragraphs are to be read as additional text to Section 4 of the published report in the main agenda pack on page 39.

- 4.3 Following consultation and review of the previous priorities, there was recognition to continue investing in 3 of the previous priorities. Developing the Prevention Offer, Addressing Disproportionality and Focusing on our Education, Training and Employment work will all be retained. These align with Council priorities and seek to directly address systemic inequalities for some of Camden's children and families. In addition, 3 new priorities have been agreed by the board. These are Tackling Domestic Violence and Abuse, Supporting Victims of Youth Crime and Enhancing Transitional Safeguarding Arrangements. Domestic Violence and Abuse and Supporting Victims of Youth Crime will both align with wider strategies under development within the council and both will have a preventative and responsive elements in terms of the Youth Justice work. Transitional Safeguarding Arrangements will seek to better connect children and adult's services for children and young people involved in the Youth Justice System with multiple needs.
- 4.4 In addition to the standard priorities of reducing first time entrants, reducing re-offending and the use of custody, the new Youth Justice Service Priorities for 2023-2028 are:
- 1. Tackling Domestic Violence and Abuse**
  - 2. Supporting Victims of Youth Crime**
  - 3. Addressing Disproportionality**
  - 4. Enhancing Education, Training and Employment Offer (ETE)**
  - 5. Continue to expand and improve the YJS Prevention Offer**
  - 6. Enhance Transitional Safeguarding Arrangements and reduce the risk of re-offending for children leaving our service.**
