1. The Application

- 1.1. A Temporary Event Notice has been given by the premises user for an event to take place as described below.

Date of Events:

Friday 19 December – 21 December 00:00 – 06:00

Wednesday 31 December – Thursday 1 January 00:00 – 06:00

a) Licensable Activity:

- i. Supply of Alcohol (For consumption on the premises)

ii. Provision of Regulated Entertainment (Indoors)

- b) Maximum number of people: 210

2. The Objection Notice

- 2.1. An objection notice was received from the Police on 18 November 2025 and Environmental Health responsible authority on 17 November 2025

3. Licensing objectives (Chapter Four Pages 20-25 of the policy)

- 3.1. The objection notice was given because the responsible authorities believe that the following licensing objectives will be undermined by the event:
- a) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
 - b) The Prevention of Public Nuisance

4. Recommendations

- 4.1. Members are advised to give consideration to the temporary event notice and the objection notice that have been submitted, and to this report.
- 4.2. Having considered the temporary event notice, the objection notice, the legislative provisions, and the Guidance issued by the Secretary of State, Members have the following options:
- a) Allow the event to go ahead as set out in the Temporary Event Notice.
 - b) Impose one or more conditions on the Temporary Event Notice as long as those conditions are for the promotion of the licensing objectives set out in paragraph 3.1, already exist on a premises licence for the relevant premises, and are consistent with the proposed licensable activity.
 - c) If the licensing objectives in paragraph 3.1 are likely to be undermined a counter notice must be served on the premises user.
- 4.3. Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
