## **Application**

- 1.1 This is an application for a new premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003. **Appendix 2**
- 1.2 The application is for:
  - a) **Sale of Alcohol (Off Premises Only)**  
08:00 – 22:30 Monday to Sunday
  - b) **Opening hours**  
08:00 – 22:30 Monday to Sunday
- 1.3 The applicant has agreed to accept 2 additional conditions, requested by the Police, acting as a Responsible Authority.
- 1.4 On the basis that the additional conditions have been agreed and accepted by the applicant, the Police have not made a representation. Correspondence can be found at **Appendix 2**.

- 2.1 Two representations were received in relation to the application.

## **3. Policy**

### Licensing objectives (Chapter Four Page 30 to 44 of the Policy)

- 3.1 The licensing objectives engaged by this application are:
  - a) The Prevention of Public Nuisance
  - b) The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
  - c) The Protection of Children from Harm

### Hours policy (Chapter Five- Page 47 to 49 of the Policy)

- 3.2 The hours policy is engaged by this application in relation to the proposed time for the sale of alcohol on Sundays. The framework hours are given in the policy as:

#### **Supply of alcohol off the premises**

Monday to Saturday	08:00am until 23:30
pm Sunday	10:00am until 23:00
pm	

- 3.3 The times for the framework hours on any given day are not (and should not be regarded as) the “usual” or “normal” working hours for licensable activities in the Borough. Instead, the framework hours serve to identify those cases where the Licensing Authority will pay particular regard to the likely effect on the local neighbourhood of carrying out the proposed licensable activities.

Women’s Safety (Chapter 4 – Page 30 to 32 of the Policy)

- 3.4 The Council has adopted a set of principles that commit our licensed premises to act in a responsible manner, taking all forms of female harassment seriously and set out the practical steps licensed premises can take to support this.

The principles encourage all licensed premises to consider and implement them in the day to day operation of their premises and include:

- a. Let’s Communicate
- b. Supporting Each Other
- c. Training for All

The application does not include these principles.

- a) Grant the application in full with such conditions on the licence that are consistent with the operating schedule.
- b) Grant the application subject to revised conditions that they consider appropriate to promote the licensing objectives.
- c) Reject the whole or part of the application.

5.3 Members may attach additional conditions if they consider it appropriate for the promotion of the licensing objectives raised in the representations.

5.4 Members are reminded that all applications must be considered on their own merits, and that findings on any issues of fact should be on the balance of probability.
