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Fit for the Future	This programme focussed on engaging communities on the three key system challenges: achieving financial balance, great services (i.e. providing sufficient, high quality and timely care), and happy healthy lives (i.e. the shift from treatment towards prevention).										Engagement: An extensive programme of public engagement was undertaken, in four stages, between June 2024 and March 2025. This was multimethodology work using a broad spectrum of approaches. Overall, we had conversations with 2,413 people. 549 people took part in surveys and 146,649 were reached through social media.	The findings have been written up as a series of reports. These are presently going through governance to identify steps needed to embed the learning and take forward actions in response. The reports and the resulting actions will be published in due course. Follow up work on some of the key themes has already begun.
