1. **Summary**

- 1.1. This is an application for a premises licence to allow authorisation for the recorded music and supply of alcohol on Monday to Sunday.

2. **Application**

- 2.1. Dak Dak Ltd has made an application for a premises licence under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.
- 2.2. The applicant is seeking authorisation for the following licensable activities and times:

6. **Guidance Considerations**

- 6.1. The Licensing Authority is required to have regard to any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under the Licensing Act 2003.

7. **Policy Considerations**

- 7.1. Licensing Sub-Committee is required to have regard to the London Borough of Hackney's Statement of Licensing Policy ("the Policy") adopted by the Licensing Authority.
- 7.2. The Policy applies to applications where relevant representations have been made. With regard to this application, policies, LP1 (General Principles), LP2 (Licensing Objectives), LP3 (Core Hours), LP4 (Off Sales of Alcohol) and LP12 (Cumulative Impact- General) are relevant.

8. **Officer Observations**

- 8.1. If the Sub-Committee is minded to approve the application, the following conditions should be applied the licence:

Supply of Alcohol(On/Both)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be

made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.

(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -

(a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;

(i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or

(ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);

(b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;

(d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.

(e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

4. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
5. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.  
5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.  
5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible

person to be under 18 years if age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-

- A. a holographic mark or
- B. an ultraviolet feature.

6. The responsible person shall ensure that:
- a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
    - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
    - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
    - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
      - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
      - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

#### Minimum Drinks Pricing

7. 7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -  $P = D + (D \times V)$  Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence,  
or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(e) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the

club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(f) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub- paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

#### **Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

8. The premises shall maintain a comprehensive CCTV system covering all public areas and all recording shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days and include date and time stamping.
9. Adequate staffing levels and supervision will be maintained during operating hours.
10. Staff will receive health and safety and emergency procedure training.
11. Deliveries and collections will be managed to reduce noise disruption.
12. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as a driving licence, passport or proof of age card with the PASS Hologram.
13. All staff receive training on the legislation relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons.

#### **Conditions derived from responsible authority representations**

14. Amplified sound (prerecorded music) on the premises shall be played at such a level as not to cause a nuisance to any un-associated noise sensitive premises.
15. All plant and equipment shall be maintained in good working order and serviced once a year.

16. Patrons shall not be permitted to take open containers of alcohol, glasses, or glass bottles outside onto the public highway at any time.
17. Notices shall be prominently displayed at all exits requesting patrons to leave the area quietly.
18. No music shall be played in any external areas.
19. Alcohol for consumption off the premises shall be made to members of the general public entering the premises solely for that purpose. There shall be no passing, takeaway-only, or walk-in street trade.
20. The Licensee shall ensure that all relevant staff are fully trained and made aware of the legal requirement of businesses to comply with their responsibility as regards the disposal of waste produced from the business premises. The procedure for handling and preparing for disposal of the waste shall be in writing and displayed in a prominent place where it can be referred to at all times by staff.
21. The Licensee shall ensure that any contract for general and recyclable waste disposal shall be appropriate in size to the amount of waste produced by the business. The Licensee shall maintain an adequate supply of waste receptacles provided by his registered waste carrier (refuse sacks or commercial waste bins) in order to ensure all refuse emanating from the business is always presented for collection by his waste carrier and shall not use any plain black or unidentifiable refuse sacks or any other unidentifiable or unmarked waste receptacles.
22. The Licensee's premises are situated in an area within which refuse may only be left on the public highway at certain times (time bands). If the Licensee's waste carrier cannot or does not comply by collecting the refuse within an hour after the close of any time band imposed by the waste authority, the Licensee must remove the refuse from the public highway and/or keep it within the premises until such time as his/her waste carrier arrives to collect the refuse.
23. The Licensee shall instruct members of staff to make regular checks of the area immediately outside the premises and remove any litter, bottles and glasses emanating from the premises. A final check should be made at close of business.
24. The Licensee shall provide a safe receptacle for cigarette ends to be placed outside for the use of customers, such receptacle being carefully placed so as not to cause an obstruction or trip.
25. The current trade waste agreement/duty of care waste transfer document shall be conspicuously displayed and maintained in the window of the premises where it can be conveniently seen and read by persons standing in 93 Stoke Newington Church Street. This should remain unobstructed at all times and should clearly identify:-

- the name of the registered waste carrier
- the date of commencement of trade waste contract
- the date of expiry of trade waste contract
- the days and times of collection
- the type of waste including the European Waste Code

## 9. **Reasons for Officer Observations**

- 9.1. Conditions (8) to (13) are derived from applicant's operating schedule. Conditions (14) to (19) were agreed upon with the Environmental Protection and conditions (20) to (25) were agreed upon with the Environmental Enforcement.

## 10. **Legal Comments**

- 10.1. The Council has a duty as a Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003 to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the following 4 licensing objectives;

- The Prevention of Crime and Disorder
- Public Safety
- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- The Protection of Children from Harm

- 10.2. It should be noted that each of the licensing objectives have equal importance and are the only grounds upon which a relevant representation can be made and for which an application can be refused or terms and conditions attached to a licence.

## 11. **Human Rights Act 1998 Implications**

- 11.1. There are implications to;
- **Article 6** – Right to a fair hearing
  - **Article 14** – Not to discriminate
  - Balancing: **Article 1**- Peaceful enjoyment of their possession (i.e. a licence is defined as being a possession) with **Article 8** – Right of Privacy (i.e. respect private & family life) to achieve a proportionate decision having regard to the protection of an individuals rights against the interests of the community at large.

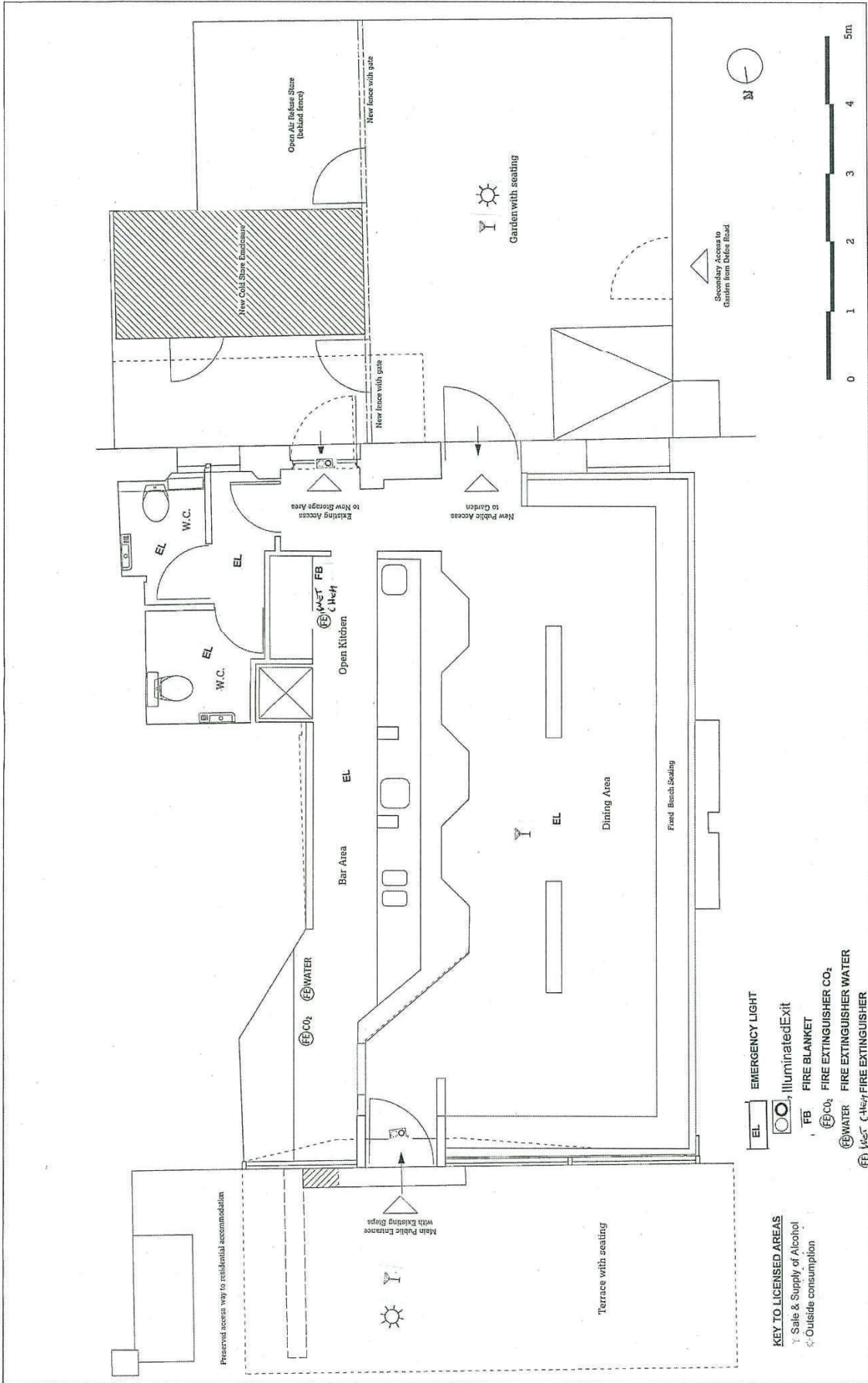

Thank you for forwarding the representation received in relation to our premises licence application for The Good Egg, 93 Stoke Newington Church Street, and for your time on the phone earlier today.

We really appreciate the time the resident has taken to submit their comments and understand the concerns they have raised.

We hope this response clarifies that our application is not seeking to extend the premises' previously licensed opening hours or alcohol sales hours. Our intention is simply to replace the previous premises licence with one that reflects the permissions and conditions that were previously in place, rather than to change in any way the operation of the premises.

The premises currently operates predominantly as a daytime business and has not run a regular evening restaurant service since last year. The overwhelming majority of business activity now concludes by around 6:00pm, with staff generally having left the premises by that time. While it is important to retain the flexibility previously granted under the previous licence, there are no current plans to intensify the operation of the premises or change its character as a food-led neighbourhood restaurant.

We appreciate that, if this application had been seeking to extend our operating hours or fundamentally change the nature of the business, residents would quite reasonably have concerns. Fortunately, that is not what this application is intended to do, and we hope the clarification above provides reassurance.

We are very happy for the replacement licence to reflect the previous licence conditions, including the requirement that any recorded music is played only at background level, allowing normal face-to-face conversation. We are also willing to accept additional conditions to provide further reassurance to neighbouring residents. These include:

- maintaining recorded music at background level only;
- keeping doors and windows closed while recorded music is playing (other than for access and egress);
- restricting bottle disposal into external bins during the evening and overnight;
- displaying notices requesting customers to leave the area quietly;
- providing a direct management contact for residents should any concerns arise; and
- formalising our longstanding no-smoking policy, which has been in place for approximately ten years at the request of neighbouring residents and covers the front forecourt, rear garden and the immediate entrance to the premises. We are also happy to install additional prominent No Smoking signage to reinforce this policy.

Above all, we would like to reassure both the Licensing Authority and our neighbours that our objective is to continue operating a successful food-led neighbourhood restaurant whilst maintaining a positive relationship with those living nearby. We hope this response demonstrates that we have listened carefully to the concerns raised and, where appropriate, have volunteered additional safeguards that go beyond those previously required.

If it would be helpful, we would be very happy to meet with the resident(s), or speak by telephone, to discuss any remaining concerns with a view to resolving the matter without the need for a Licensing Sub-Committee hearing.

I am hereby putting forth my objections to a late night licensing of said restaurant. The Good Egg  
[93 Stoke Newington Church Street London N16 0AS](#)

My objections are as follows:

Due to living [REDACTED] above, I am the resident who would be most immediately affected by any extension of the restaurant's hours for the sale of alcohol and the playing of music.

I strongly object to this application because it would have a significant adverse impact on my home and quality of life.

My concerns include:

- Increased noise from customers drinking, talking, and leaving the premises late at night.
- Music transmitted through the building, particularly as my flat is [REDACTED] above the restaurant.
- Disturbance from staff closing down the premises and clearing bottles and waste.
- Loss of peaceful enjoyment of my home and disruption to my sleep, as my bedroom and living room are at the front of the property.
- The likelihood that patrons consuming alcohol later into the evening will create additional noise both inside and outside the premises.

Although the premises may currently operate as a restaurant, extending Licensing hours for alcohol and music materially changes the nature of its operation and the impact on me and neighbouring residents.

As the occupier of the flat [REDACTED] above, I believe I would bear the greatest burden of these disturbances. My home should remain a place where I can reasonably expect peace and quiet during normal sleeping hours.

I respectfully submit that granting this application would undermine the Licensing objective of preventing public nuisance.

If the Licensing Authority is minded to grant any variation, I request that it instead considers imposing strict conditions, including:

- No amplified music that can be heard in neighbouring residential properties.
- Earlier cessation of alcohol sales and music.
- Doors and windows to remain closed during entertainment.
- Prominent notices requesting customers leave quietly.

- Effective dispersal polices for customers leaving the premises.

However, my primary position is that the application should be refused.

I already experience noise from the premises, even under the current licence due to the building having poor insulation.

I ask that the Licensing Sub-Committee carefully considers the significant impact this application would have on my ability to peacefully enjoy my home and the Licensing objective of preventing public nuisance. This objection is made after careful consideration of the likely consequences of the proposed variation. I have genuine concerns that the extended hours for alcohol and music will have a substantial and ongoing impact on my home, particularly as my living accommodation is [REDACTED] above the premises.

In light of all the above, I respectfully request that the Licensing Sub-Committee refuses this application. I ask that my written representation is given full and careful consideration, as I am the resident who would be most directly affected by the proposed extension of licencing hours. Thank you for your consideration.

Thank you for forwarding the applicant's response. I have considered the information provided.

I wish to confirm that I maintain my representation.

While I note the applicant's explanation that the premises currently operates predominantly as a daytime business and that there is no present intention to intensify the operation, the application would still permit late evening licensable activities, including alcohol sales until 23:00 and recorded music until 23:30.

My concern is not about the current day-to-day operation, but about the potential impact of the licensed activities if exercised in full in future.

I live [REDACTED] above the premises and already experience noise disturbance arising from the building's structure and limited sound insulation. In this context, I remain concerned about the risk of public nuisance, particularly during evening hours.

While I note the proposed additional conditions, I am not fully persuaded that they would be sufficient in practice to prevent noise transmission and disturbance in a residential setting where living accommodation is directly above the premises.

I therefore respectfully request that my representation is taken into account in full when determining the application, with particular regard to the licensing objective of the prevention of public nuisance.

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence:
  - (a) At a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence.
  - (b) At a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.
2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.
3. (1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.  
  
(2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises -
  - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to;
    - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
    - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
  - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
  - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social behaviour or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner.
4. dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of a disability).

5. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
6. 5.1. The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sales or supply of alcohol.  
5.2 The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licences must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.  
5.3. The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either:-
  - A. a holographic mark or
  - B. an ultraviolet feature.
7. The responsible person shall ensure that:
  - a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a securely closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures:
    - beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
    - gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25ml or 35ml; and
    - still wine in a glass: 125ml; and
      - a. these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
      - b. where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

### **Minimum Drinks Pricing**

7.1 A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

7.2 For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 7.1 above -

(a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;

(b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula -  $P = D + (D \times V)$

Where -

(i) P is the permitted price,

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(c) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence -

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol

under such a licence;

(e) “relevant person” means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and

(f) “value added tax” means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

7.3 Where the permitted price given by Paragraph 8.2(b) above would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

7.4 (1) Sub-paragraph 7.4(2) below applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph 7.2(b) above on a day (“the first day”) would be different from the permitted price on the next day (“the second day”) as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

## **Annex 2 – Conditions consistent with the Operating Schedule**

8. All relevant staff to be trained in their responsibility under the Licensing Act 2003. Records of staff training to be made available for inspection by the Licensing Authority or Responsible Authorities upon reasonable request.

### **Conditions derived from Responsible Authority representations**

9. The premises shall install and maintain a comprehensive CCTV system as per the minimum requirements of a Metropolitan Police Crime Prevention Officer. All entry and exit points will be covered enabling frontal identification of every person entering in any light condition. The CCTV system shall continually record whilst the premises is open for licensable activities and during all times when customers remain on the premises. All recordings shall be stored for a minimum period of 31 days with date and time stamping. Recordings shall be made available immediately upon the request of Police or authorised officer throughout the preceding 31-day period.

10. There shall be a staff member from the premises who is conversant with the operation of the CCTV system on the premises at all times when the premises are open to the public. This staff member must be able to show a Police or authorised council officer recent data or footage when requested.

11. There shall be “CCTV in Operation” signs prominently displayed.

12. Signs will be prominently displayed at all entrance and exit points reminding customers to leave quietly and respect local residents.

13. A Challenge 25 proof of age scheme shall be operated at the premises where the only acceptable forms of identification are recognised photographic identification cards, such as driving licence or passport.

14. Intoxicating liquor shall not be sold, supplied or consumed otherwise than to persons who are taking a substantial meal from the menu and that the consumption of intoxicating liquor by such persons is ancillary to taking such meals. The supply of alcohol will be by waiter/waitress service only.

15. An incident log shall be kept at the premises, and made available on request to an authorised officer of the council or the police, which will record the following.

- a. All crimes reported:
- b. All ejections of patrons
- c. Any complaints received.
- d. Any incidents of disorder.
- e. Seizure of drugs or offensive weapons.
- f. Any faults in the CCTV system or searching equipment or scanning equipment.
- g. Any refusal of the sale of alcohol.
- h. Any visit by a relevant authority or emergency service.

16. Premises to operate zero tolerance policy to drugs and comply with Hackney Police Drugs, Weapons and Theft policy where appropriate.

17. All staff receive training on the legislation relating to the sale of alcohol to underage persons and drunken persons.

18. The outside space at the front of the premises shall be not be used after 21:00, except by patrons smoking

19. The outside space to the rear of the premises shall not be used after 18:00

20. All music at the premises shall be played at background level ONLY at all times to allow face to face conversation

21. The licensee shall ensure that noise from the business operations including delivery and collections and patron voices both within and at the forecourts shall, at all times, not cause noise nuisance to local residents

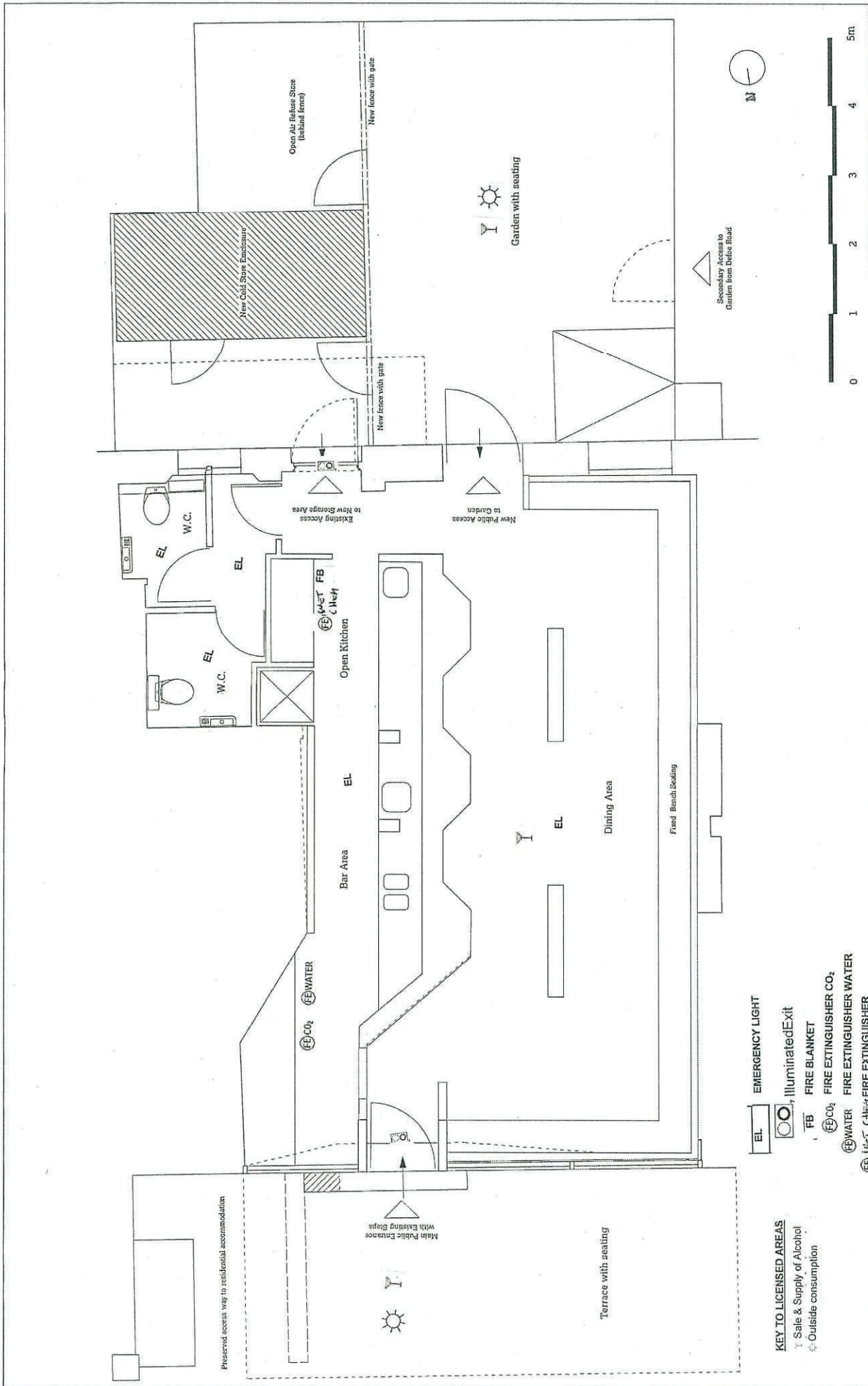
### **Annex 3 – Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority**

22. After 21:00 there shall be a maximum of 6 smokers outside the front of the premises at any one time. The management of the premises shall use their best endeavours to ensure that this condition is complied with.

23. The licensee shall put in place measures to delineate the front outside area of the premises from the public footpath, such measures to be agreed in writing by the Licensing Authority.
