- Air pollution.
- Noise pollution.
- Distance from local amenities.
- Construction disturbance.
- Impacts on school children and teaching staff at local schools during the construction and operational phases.
- Impact on highways (including additional traffic, school streets and child road safety).
- Impacts on wildlife
- Scale and height of the development.

In addition, concerns were raised by third parties in relation to communications between the applicant team and local residents.
