1. Summary
 - 1.1. Council is asked to approve a draft programme of Ordinary Meetings of the Council for the year, to be finalised at the next Annual Meeting.
2. Recommendation
 - 2.1. To approve the draft meetings programme for 2026-27 as set out in Appendix 1; and
 - 2.2. To note that the programme will be finalised at the Annual Council Meeting on 21 May 2026.
3. Background
 - 3.1. The Council Procedure Rules state that a draft meetings programme, be agreed at a Council meeting before it is finalised at the Annual Meeting.
 - 3.2. This will give early notification of meeting dates and enable councillors to enter meeting dates in their diaries, recognising that the final decisions on establishment and membership of committees at the Annual Meeting on 21 May 2026 may alter the programme.
4. Proposal
 - 4.1. The proposed dates of Council, Cabinet, Committees, and other bodies in 2026/27 are set out in the attached schedule (Appendix 1). The schedule is based on the current committee structure and the current

frequency of meetings. It is possible that changes may need to be made to the schedule following approval.

- 4.2. The meetings schedule for 2026/27 will be finalised at the Annual Council meeting on 21 May 2026 as required in the Council's Constitution. It is also proposed, where appropriate, to submit to the first meeting of a committee following the AGM a list of its meeting dates for the following 12 months. Consequently, there will be further opportunities for changes to meeting dates if required.
- 4.3. The number of meetings of each council body scheduled in the 2026/27 Municipal Year (i.e. between June 2026 and May 2027) is as follows:

5.1. The group whips have been consulted on the schedule.

6. Implications

6.1. Finance, Value for Money and Risk

6.1.1. The number and frequency of meetings is balanced with the need for efficient decision-making and monitoring of Council performance.

6.2. Legal

6.2.1. The draft schedule satisfies legal requirements in respect of statutory meetings and the duties of councillors, and the provisions of the Council's Constitution in respect of meetings.

6.3. Equalities and Diversity

6.3.1. A number of additional faith days are noted in the schedule, reflecting the multi-cultural make-up of the Borough, although only the faith dates and cultural events significantly observed in the Borough as a whole are kept free of meetings.
